### **Industry News**



Alupang Cove Condominium Exterior Wall Replacement Project

For the seventh consecutive year, Black Construction Corporation has earned the coveted award as "**Contractor of the Year**". This year's recipient went to the Alupang Cove Condominium, Exterior Wall Replacement Project.

The scope of this contract was to precast 9 to 13 ton concrete wall panels on site. The precast panels would then be lifted using a 100 ton crawler crane and placed one on top of the other, on the exterior of the structure. A temporary gypsum board partition would then be constructed 3' into the living space of each unit. This would allow the existing metal frame to be removed. New windows and sliding doors were installed, the walls painted and the temporary partition removed. Each tenant now has gained 24 square feet of additional living space and a new exterior typhoon proof concrete wall. The entire existing and new structure also received a new paint coating of Exterior Finish System and elastomeric roof coating.

One unique aspect of the project was that construction occurred while the units were still occupied by tenants. Because of this, site safety was a crucial factor and imperative to the success of the project for both the construction worker and the tenants. Tenants were notified of each activity and the potential hazards involved.

The contract also consisted of the upgrade of the swimming pool and lobby entrance facilities. The swimming pool facility was upgraded to have two new concrete picnic pavilions, a barbeque counter, sink, and pool deck and landscaping. The lobby area would consist of a new manager's office, mail room and a trash chute.

### Safety Bulletin

#### HEAT STRESS

When the body is unable to cool itself by sweating, several heat-induced illnesses such as heat stress or heat exhaustion and the more severe heat stroke can occur, and result in death.

#### Factors Leading to Heat Stress

High temperature and humidity; direct sun or heat; limited air movement; physical exertion; poor physical condition; some medicines; and inadequate tolerance for hot workplaces.

#### Symptoms of Heat Exhaustion

- Headaches, dizziness, lightheadedness or fainting.
- Weakness and moist skin.
- Mood changes such as irritability or confusion.
- Upset stomach or vomiting.

#### **Preventing Heat Stress**

- Know signs/symptoms of heat-related illnesses; monitor yourself and coworkers.
- Block out direct sun or one headsources.
- Use cooling fans/air-conditioning; rest regularly.
- Drink lots of water; about 1 cup every 15 minutes.
- Wear lightweight, light colored, loose-fitting clothes.
- Avoid alcohol, caffeinated drinks, or heavy meals.

#### What to Do for Heat-Related Illness

• Call 911 (or local emergency number) at once.

While waiting for help to arrive

- Move the worker to a cool, shaded area.
- Loosen or remove heavy clothing.
- Provide cool drinking water.
- Fan and mist the person with water.
