<mark>Global Hawk</mark>

On May 23, 2007, the Global Hawk Maintenance and Operations Complex Project was awarded to Black Construction Corporation. The new hangar facility will house up to 6 unmanned Global Hawk aircraft. The facility is located at Andersen Air Force Base. The aircraft's missions support the military and many of the U.S. national security and intelligencegathering agencies. This is the second aircraft hangar that BCC will have constructed since 2005 at Andersen AFB. The B-2 hangar project won national awards for excellence and the Global HAWK team is striving to achieve similar recognition.
